Ginny was present at the founding of the Ridgewood-Wilton Neighborhood Association in 1978 in response to plans by the City to straighten the curves and make Wilton Place a junior equivalent of Western Ave. She served among the first several Presidents of the Association and in the many years since has nearly continuously served on the Board (most recently as a Member-At-Large), offered her house as a meeting place, served as a repository of information of the history of our houses, and been a fierce, unyielding advocate for their preservation.

A glimpse of Ginny at the top of her game is preserved in the video on the auctioning of the formerly condemned Wilton Place houses, available on the Association web site, www.ridgewoodwilton.com. More details of her life beyond the Association will surely appear in an obituary in one or many of the local papers; I will attempt to see that it receives wide circulation.
